As we enter the season of Epiphany, we are invited to reflect on the profound truths of Christ's mission and the Church's foundation through two significant commemorations: the Confession of St. Peter and the Conversion of St. Paul. These two festivals frame the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, calling us to remember the bold witness of the apostles and to strive for unity in the Body of Christ.



The Confession of St. Peter – January 18

On this evening, we will gather for worship to give thanks for Peter's confession, which reminds us of the foundation of our faith in Jesus as the Messiah. Peter, despite his failings, stands as a testament to God's grace and the transformative power of the Gospel.

The Conversion of St. Paul – January 25

Paul's dramatic encounter on the road to Damascus, as recorded in Acts 9, reveals the life-changing power of God's call. From persecutor of the Church to its most fervent apostle, Paul's story reminds us that no one is beyond the reach of God's mercy. Join us for worship as we reflect on how God uses even the most unlikely people to proclaim His glory.



We will celebrate both of these festivals with Evening Prayer (Vespers) at 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. Through the beauty of liturgy, Scripture, and song, we will lift our hearts to God, remembering the faithful witness of Peter and Paul. Following each service, we will gather for a time of fellowship and refreshments in the PLC.

These commemorations are more than a celebration of the past; they are a call to live boldly in faith, confessing Christ and sharing His love with the world. We look forward to worshiping and rejoicing together as we grow in unity and purpose as the body of Christ.

ENDOWMENT HIGHLIGHT Africa Inland Mission

Established in 1895, **Africa Inland Mission (AIM)** is a Christian mission-sending agency focused on Africa and African beliefs around the globe.

Africa Inland Mission has been leading people into meaningful ministry for over 100 years, but the work is far from finished. As we press on, we lean into the critical task of mobilizing, equipping, training, and sending local African believers and missionaries toward this great calling. We continue to adapt and embrace creative ways to bring the message of Christ to an ever-changing world.

Today, hundreds of Africa's unique ethnic people groups remain unreached – that's over 300 million people with no viable witness to the good news. Africa Inland Mission serves, equips, and mobilizes churches and believers from the global Church to advance the gospel among Africans who have the least opportunity to hear about Jesus.

Africa Inland Mission's stated mission is to see "Christ-centered Churches established among all African peoples." Their goal is to introduce <u>Jesus Christ</u> to those who have never heard of him. AIM seeks to help new believers grow strong and healthy in their faith and to see new believers enfolded into a maturing church. The organization aims to invest in the lives of current and future church leaders so they can effectively affect the lives of others who can in turn reach out to the vast population of Africa and beyond. The Mission Handbook gives AIM's goal "to plant maturing churches...through the evangelization of unreached people groups and the effective preparation of church leaders."

AIM's passion and the passion of those who serve as missionaries of the Good News is to see the worship of Jesus Christ spread among Africans around the globe through individual lives fully committed to him

Holy Trinity Endowment has supported David and Danetta Kellar and their work with AIM over the past years, and an Endowment grant was approved again for 2025 for their life changing work to continue.

HOW DO YOUR FINANCIAL GIFTS GLORIFY GOD?

¹⁶ Three times a year all your men must appear before the Lord your God at the place he will choose: at the Festival of Unleavened Bread, the Festival of Weeks and the Festival of Tabernacles. No one should appear before the Lord empty-handed: ¹⁷ Each of you must bring a gift in proportion to the way the Lord your God has blessed you. (Deuteronomy 16: 16-17 NIV)

We see in this verse, three times a year every male was to make a journey to the sanctuary in the city, that would be designated as Israel's religious capital. At these festivals, each participant was **encouraged to give what he could in proportion to what God had given him.** God does not expect us to give more than we can, but we will be blessed when we give cheerfully. For some, 10 percent may be a burden. For most of us, that would be far too little. **Look at what you have and then give in proportion to what you have been given. What is your response to those blessings God has bestowed on you?**
