He will preside at the 8:30 liturgy, and we will have what is called an extended distribution for 11:00. This is all done in accordance with the tradition of the church. There will be no gaps in sacramental care.

SUMMER LADIES' BIBLE STUDY *Beginning Wednesday, May 15*



The city of ancient Corinth was much like our own modern-day cities: a melting pot of electrifying cultural experiences to be had, along with the myriad pitfalls of spiritual depravity. Still, Paul wrote to the church of God in Corinth. Meaning God's church is meant to thrive in any city and every circumstance in which we find ourselves. Paul's letter is as timely as ever.

Over 8 sessions, Kelly Minter will lead you through the Letter of 2 Corinthians, exploring the anchoring truths of bearing treasures in jars of clay, meeting Christ through a pressing thorn, opening wide your heart in the midst of hurtful relationships, and what it means to embrace the lost and lonely as ministers of the new covenant. Each of us has a message to proclaim and live by: Because of Jesus the old has gone, **the new has come**.

- Grow in biblical literacy with in-depth study of the Book of 2 Corinthians.
- Discover how God can use you no matter your cultural setting.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

A Look Back . . . and a Look Ahead

Do you know what happened in 1899? A peace treaty between the United States and Spain was signed following the Spanish-American War. Less than a week later, the U.S. acquired the Philippines, Guam, and Puerto Rico. Additionally, voting machines were approved by the U.S. Congress for elections. And, Al Capone, Duke Ellington, Fred Astaire, Ernest Hemingway, and Humphrey Bogart were all born.

Do you know what else happened in 1899? **Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church was founded in Gastonia, NC.** It was started by 22 faithful people who had a vision. Think about that . . . with the help and guidance of God, 22 people birthed something that has lived on for 125 years and touched the lives of thousands and thousands of people through worship and service. What a legacy!

So often, we hear people talking about the church “dying.” The church is not going to die. She is Christ’s bride, and we know that Christ conquers all. The Word of God tells us so. Christ gave His life for us, and He will not let the church fail. We may falter but we will not fail. Not only does the Word of God support this, but history does as well. Just think about those 22 people who stepped out in faith 125 years ago. I’m sure their journey was not easy. And, I’m sure they tried and failed at many things, but we stand together today as testimony to their faithfulness and perseverance.

This heritage should embolden us to continue laying the foundation for the next 125 years. If we, as a collective unit, knew that we could not fail, what would we do to draw others to Christ, to serve and love the less fortunate, to bring glory to God in our lives and communities? Would we lay aside our fear of rejection and need to feel accepted to speak boldly and often of Christ’s love? Would we lay aside our fear of those who are different from us to walk alongside them? Would we lay aside our fear of sickness to touch and minister to those who are sick and dirty? These are questions I ask myself. What about you?

What kind of legacy do we want to leave those worshipping at Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in 125 years? We can’t be the group who founded the church and worked so hard to build it both physically and in people. That’s been done. But, we can be remembered as the generation who started a movement in our community which grew out of a desire to love and serve those in need, both within our congregation and within the community at large. We can be the hands and feet of Christ and be known for taking His love to those who feel unloved.

There are no limits to sharing God’s love. So, Holy Trinity family, what’s our legacy going to be?

HOW DO YOUR FINANCIAL GIFTS GLORIFY GOD?

¹⁶ *Three times a year all your men must appear before the LORD your God at the place he will choose: at the Festival of Unleavened Bread, the Festival of Weeks and the Festival of Tabernacles. No one should appear before the LORD empty-handed:* ¹⁷ ***Each of you must bring a gift in proportion to the way the LORD your God has blessed you.*** (Deuteronomy 16: 16-17 NIV)

We see in this verse, three times a year every male was to make a journey to the sanctuary in the city that would be designated as Israel's religious capital. At these festivals, each participant was **encouraged to give what he could in proportion to what God had given him**. God does not expect us to give more than we can, but we will be blessed when we give cheerfully. For some, 10 percent may be a burden. For most of us, that would be far too little. **Look at what you have and then give in proportion to what you have been given. What is your response to those blessings God has bestowed on you?**

Led by the Holy Spirit, you learned the lay of the land; you helped us find to our legs, examine our strengths and our weaknesses, and move forward in the Spirit.
