We truly feel that God has led this Pastor to us, and we cannot wait for the congregation to meet him and his family. The Pastor also sensed that God is calling him and his family to Holy Trinity.

Towards the end of February, we will share with the congregation plans moving forward. We ask that you continue to be in prayer for our congregation as we prepare ourselves to welcome the Pastor and his family, and for the Pastor's current congregation as they navigate his potential departure.

My Dear People,

I spoke to the SONshiners on Wednesday, January 10 and told some stories from my ministry. Below are the exact words I said at this young man's funeral.

*I will never forget one of the most sacred moments of my life with a total stranger by the name of Ron. His friend introduced me to him, and then she* 

and his two other aunts left us alone. Even as weak as he was, Ron was able to share a desire in his heart. I asked him if he had ever been baptized. He said he was not sure. I asked him if he would like to be baptized. In a halting voice, he asked me if he could be baptized. I smiled and asked the nurse, who had just come in, if she could get me a bowl of water. She said she had a styrofoam cup. "Perfect," I said. I gently shared the story of Jesus with Ron. Then I baptized him in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Then something happened that is branded into my memory. Ron took his hand and held it over his forehead as if he were trying to keep the water there forever. I promised him that in his faith and God's grace he was God's child forever.

#### Remember these words from Jesus: Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?

I had no idea that a potter had come to Ron's funeral. About two months later I received a call from him. He wanted to give me something. We met and he told me that he had heard the story about the styrofoam cup. He determined that I needed a true baptismal bowl and pitcher. While at Hospice, I baptized seven patients in their homes. Today the bowl and pitcher are in the Gordon Hospice House in Statesville, NC.

The Council met on Saturday, January 6 to "vision" and discuss the future ministry of Holy Trinity. The Call Committee is working toward calling a new Lead Pastor. I say this to you, the followers of Jesus here at Holy Trinity, and to the Call Committee: Be willing to be shaped by the Lord. Pray for His desire for Holy Trinity. The potter took a lump of clay and made the beautiful bowl and pitcher pictured above. Read the words from Jeremiah 18:1-4 (ESV): <sup>1</sup> The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD: <sup>2</sup> "Arise, and go down to the potter's house, and there I will let you hear my words." <sup>3</sup> So I went down to the potter's house, and there he was working at his wheel. <sup>4</sup> And the vessel he was making of clay was spoiled in the potter's hand, and he reworked it into another vessel, as it seemed good to the potter to do.

### FINANCIAL HEALTH OF HOLY TRINITY FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2023

And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. (2 Cor. 9:8 NRSV)

Holy Trinity has reason for Celebration! **GOD is Good!** God continues to work through us, his disciples. It is revealed by our 2023 giving to His church that we have chosen a deeper relationship with God as we all grow in discipleship. Let's rejoice and celebrate!

I am pleased to report that our GIVING was very generous. For December, receipts were \$67,319.78, giving us total receipts for the year of \$522,880.94. We also gave away \$52,288.09 in Benevolence due to the blessing we received in 2023. The 2023 Endowment Fund made awards of \$90,259 for capital expenditures, training and scholarships, local and global outreach, and missions in our community and throughout the world.

In 2023, we operated with the congregation approved ministry budget of \$605,350. This budget was a step-infaith to revitalize Holy Trinity's mission of Knowing, Loving and Sharing Christ, and to answer God's commission to "Go and make disciples for Christ." We are expecting to close the 2023 with around \$475,000 in expenses. This is \$130,350 less in actual expenses compared to the budgeted expenses. Most of this difference came from not having a Lead Pastor for the twelve months in 2023.

The financial reporting for the year ending December 31, 2023 has not been finalized as of the time this article is being written. We are far enough into the preparation of the year-end statements to conclude that our financial health is good! Celebrate and give thanks for the work that God is doing through us!

### Year-end 2023 Highlights

- Gifts received for the 2023 year were \$522,880.94.
- Gifts received in 2023 towards general operations were \$38,081.10 less than gifts received in the previous year.
- Additional gifts received in 2023 towards designated purposes included \$8,386 to the Capital Fund, \$3,885 to Maui Disaster Relief, \$1,939 to Samaitian's Purse – Israel Response, \$320 to S.O.C.K.S., Inc., \$340 to Disaster Relief, \$560 for Hunger Relief, \$3,525 to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, \$335 to support Casa Bernabe Orphanage, \$720 to Holy Trinity music ministries, \$350 to support the BackPack Weekend Food Program – Lingerfeldt Elementary, \$600 to support Filter of Hope, \$510 for Lutheran Study Bibles for Discernment Retreat, \$822 for the Souper Bowl offering with 100% being sent to Gastonia Street Ministries and \$2,000 for Holy Trinity's Outdoor Nativity.
- Total operating income for 2023 was \$522,880.94.
- Disbursements in 2023 are being estimated to be about \$475,000. These disbursements include 9% increase in salaries paid to our staff. The disbursements were lower than planned in our budget, mostly due to not having a Lead Pastor for the twelve months of 2023.
- The 2023 Surplus of funds will be around \$47,881 (\$522,881 \$475,000). The 2022 year-end Accumulated Surplus was \$102,149 bringing the 2023 year-end Accumulated Surplus to \$150,030 (\$102,149 + \$47,881).

As you read this summary, our Church begins a new financial, calendar year with a faithful and prudent ministry plan for 2024. The congregation approved a 2024 Ministry Budget plan totaling \$630,933. As we move through 2024, I invite you to consider your response to God's grace in your life and what you are giving back to His glory! We are prayerful that we will call a Lead Pastor in 2024. We have tremendous work to be done in 2024. Our ministry plan is one way God works through Holy Trinity to serve the community and the world. I would encourage each member of our congregation to continue to make your commitments earlier as we have much work that needs to be done in this New Year.

For the last few years, we, as individuals, have been growing significantly in faith and discipleship. We have begun the next step in the process of growing as a discipleship and disciple-making church to become more skilled and comfortable in sharing Jesus with other people. As we move into 2024, I ask you to continue to pray for the financial strength of our Church and for the Holy Spirit to stir in us the joy of sharing our faith and inviting others to be a part of our community of disciples of Jesus.
